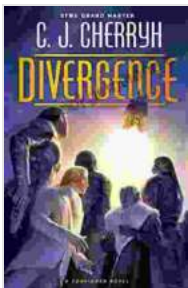


Divergence: Foreigner 21 by C.J. Cherryh: A Science Fiction Masterpiece

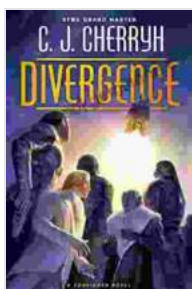

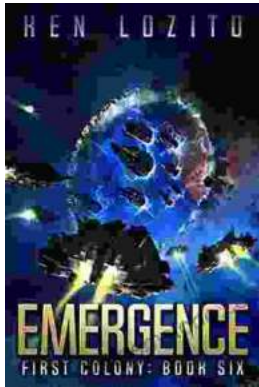
