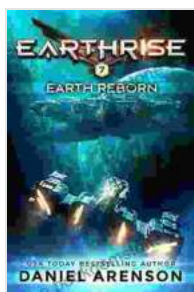

Earthrise: A Symbol of Renewal

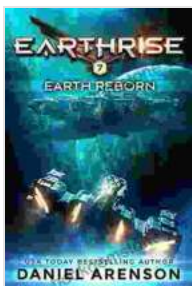

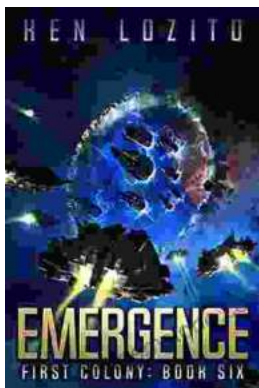
