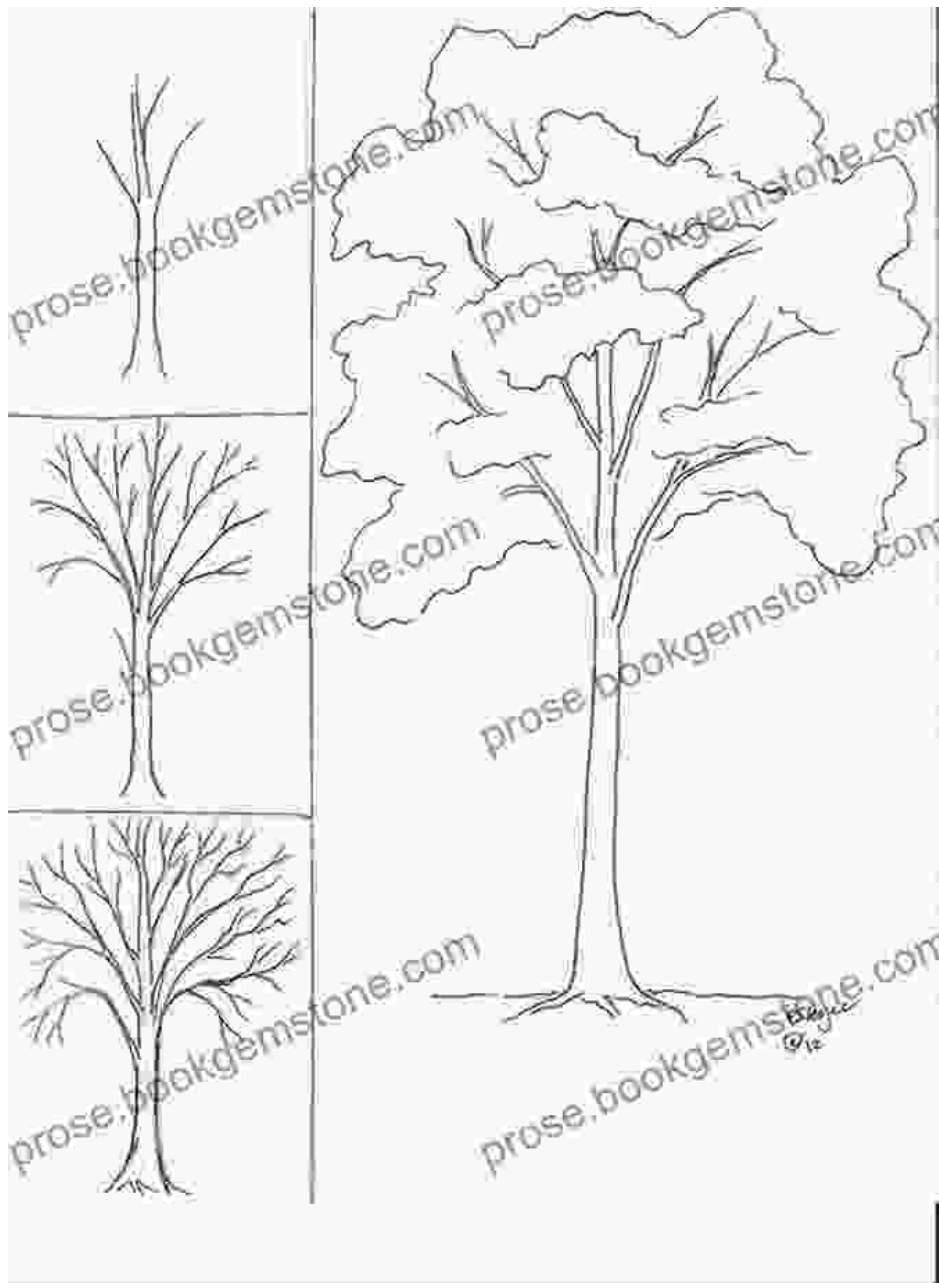

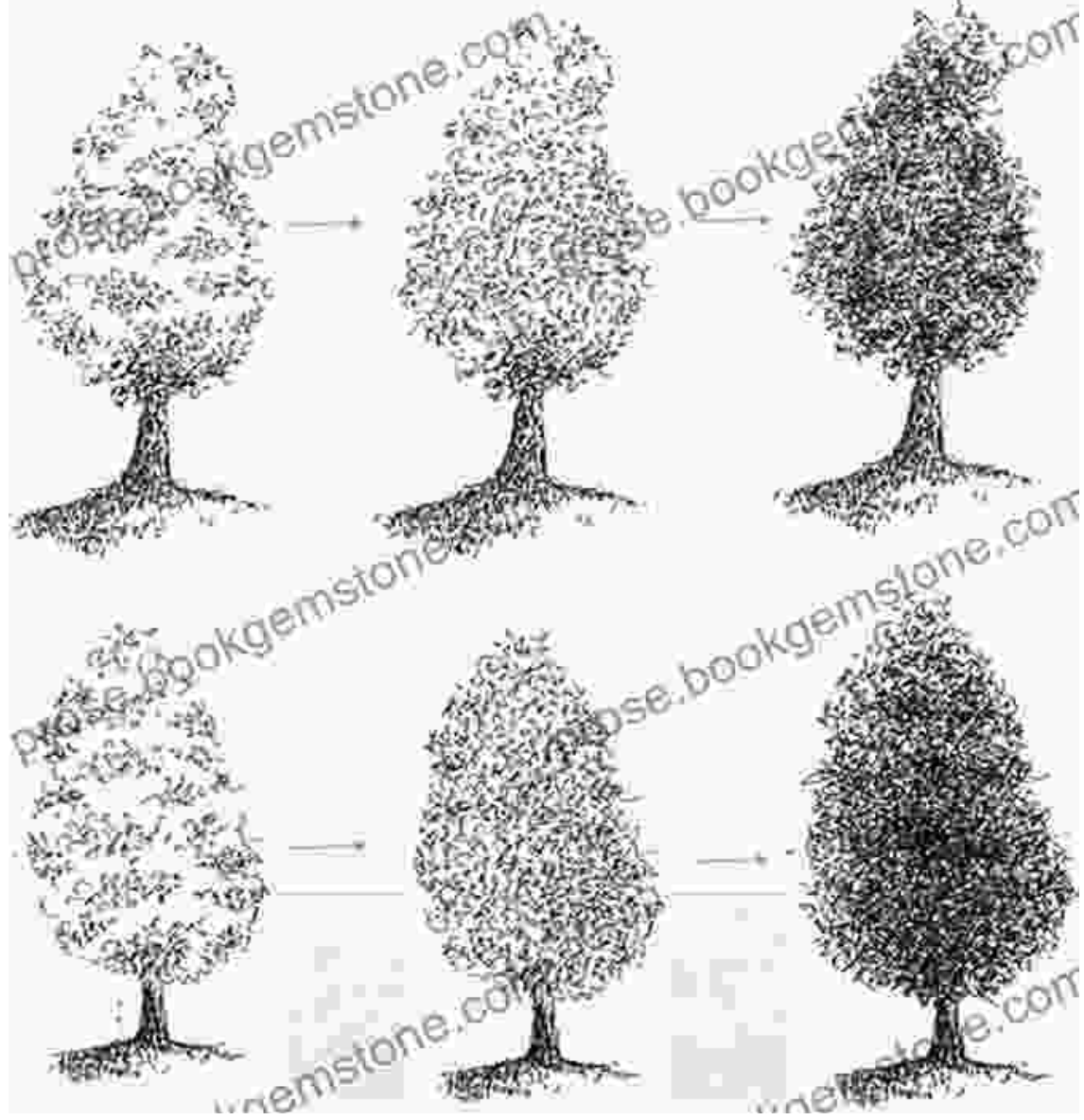




Foliage with depth due to presence of contrast!

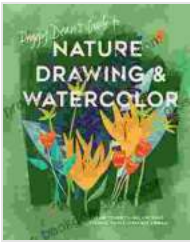

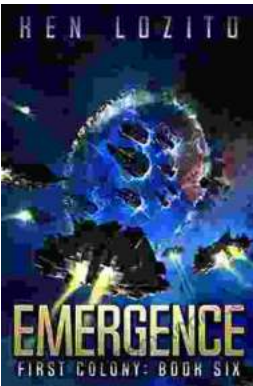
