
Nansen Explorer and Humanitarian: The Extraordinary Life of Brette Sember

Arctic Expeditions



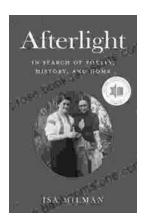
