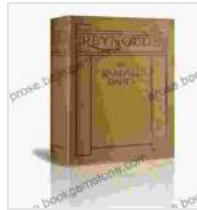

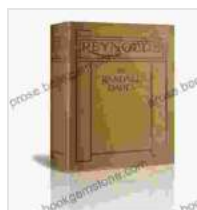
Reynolds June Foray was married to William Gladden from 1944 until his death in 1992. The couple had two children, Cynthia and Christopher.

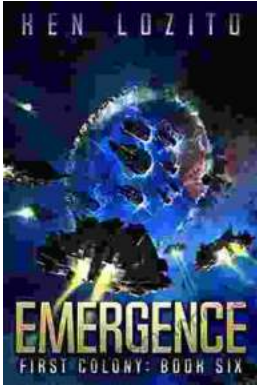
