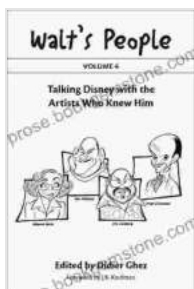
Marian Jordan

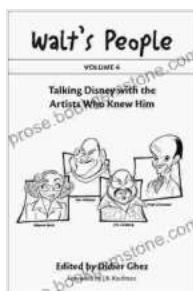
